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The Mississippi College Office of Academic Affairs recently released their President's and Dean's Lists for the fall semester.

To be eligible for the President's List, a student must maintain a 4.0 grade point average, based on a 4.0 system. The student must take a full course load of at least twelve semester hours of undergraduate credit with all academic courses impacting their grade point average.
